

MINUTES
Chapter 206
November 16, 2017

The meeting took place in the meeting room at the Yakima Airpark. There were 21 present.

- I Co-President Steve Sunquist opened the meeting at 7:06pm.

- II Guests included Gil Knotts and his two sons. Mr. Knott is a construction engineer and a former A-6 pilot. His oldest son is taking aviation courses at Central Washington University in Ellensburg.

- III A motion was made to accept the minutes of the last meeting as posted on the chapter's web sight. The motion was seconded and the motion passed.

- IV Marv Pugh, Treasurer, reported that our bank account holds \$4139.07.
 - A. The fall breakfast had a revenue of \$230.00. Expenses for the breakfast were \$274.00 for a balance of a \$43.00 deficit.
 - B. The chapter roster was passed among the members for any additions or corrections to the listed data.

- V Steve Sunquist then conducted the election of officers for the coming two years.

 - D. The voluntary gift exchange will again be conducted. The minimum cost of each item is limited to no less than \$25.00. Steve asked that the gift be tasteful and positive.

E. Marv Pugh pointed out that there will be 2 or 3 gift presentations from the drawing. Revenue from the drawing go to the maintenance fund for the meeting room.

VII The next main event is the Northwest Aviation Conference in Puyallup held on February 24th and 25th. The chapter will again look into hiring a bus for the round trip to this event on the 24th.

VIII Tom McMahon, Technical Counselor, recommended to those who have airplanes with carburetors, look into purchasing a carburetor temperature gauge. He felt that this gauge reading would help in decisions for carburetor icing as well as warming fuel on very cold flights to increase fuel efficiency.

IX Tom McMahon reported on a project with his Taylorcraft. He invited the members to look at this airplane's well cleaned engine parts, particularly cracked cylinders, pistons, etc. He also was glad to report that Continental will again manufacture cylinders for the Taylorcraft's engine.
