

## EAA MINUTES

### Chapter 206

May 19, 2016

The meeting took place at the meeting room at the Yakima Airpark. There were 24 attending.

- I The meeting was brought to order by Co-President Lance Sorensen at 7:11 pm.
- II There were no guests present.
- III A motion was made to accept the minutes of the last meeting as published on our web sight. The motion was seconded and the motion passed.
- IV Marv Pugh, treasurer, reported that our bank account has \$3658.58. He also reported that the donuts are \$7/doz.   - E. Ola Vested reported that the Young Eagle's program is still in limbo. Pilot registration can be done at the Young Eagle's web sight. It is possible that an event will be scheduled for this fall. It will be a limited event open to a designated group of children rather than an open event for the general public.

  - G. Ola is working on a fly-in at the Cle Elm airport. He is planning to have this
